Introduction

Our tuition fees are lower than many colleges offering foundation and pre-masters courses. However, we appreciate that a UK education is not affordable for many international students. Therefore, each year we offer a number of merit and financial based part scholarships, which range from 10% to 50% of the total tuition fees. Scholarships are awarded at the discretion of the College and are subject to certain conditions.

Merit scholarships

Awarded for students who can show academic excellence during their high school studies or in the case of pre-master's students during their undergraduate studies. Merit scholarships can also be awarded to students who have excelled in other activities.

Financial scholarships

Awarded based on financial means, financial scholarships are one method we use for widening participation, as outlined in our Access and Participation Statement. Applications for financial scholarships are open to all applicants, but financial scholarships are generally awarded to applicants from low or middle-income countries.

Application Process

Applications are welcome from any potential students who have applied for an IFG course and have received a IFG offer letter. All applications are assessed on their individual merits. On request IFG will send the applicant an IFG Scholarship Application Form to complete, by a specified date

- Applicants complete the form, which includes a personal statement outlining why the reason why they deserve a merit or financial scholarship and how the scholarship will support their studies
- Applicants also confirm that they are not in receipt of another major scholarship covering most tuition fees such as a scholarship granted by the Ministry of Education in their home country
- IFG aims to respond to all requests within 72 hours by email but has the right to request further information or ask the applicant to a virtual interview
- IFG considers all application on merit and all decisions by IFG are final

Scholarship conditions

To retain the scholarship for the duration of the academic year, the student must;

- Enrol on the relevant programme and maintain continuous registration
- Maintain good conduct and attendance, with no serious disciplinary findings or breaches of the College's Student Code of Conduct
